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Why go?



Plush king-size beds, air conditioning, and Nespresso machines ensure comfort, while period pieces and parquet flooring add heaps of charm. Meanwhile, marble bathrooms with luxurious amenities and a view onto the rolling hills provide a blissful escape. And then there's the tower suite for the ultimate princess-in-a-turret moment – spread across three floors, it has panoramic views and delivers the ultimate in privacy, perfect for honeymooners.

Food and drink:





Dining at Château de Candie is a feast for the senses. Chef Badara Gueye's seasonal menu celebrates local produce, serving up plates that are visually stunning and exquisitely flavoured. The intimate, candlelit ambience is perfect for honeymooners, with vintage décor adding historical charm. In summer, the outdoor terrace offers breathtaking views of the valley.

Chef Gueye's creations include seared cod fillet with vanilla cauliflower purée and strawberry vinaigrette, and L'Oeuf Parfait with sautéed mushrooms. The Foie Gras Poêlé, flambéed with Armagnac brandy, pairs rich foie gras with brioche and pear chutney. For dessert, the chocolate fondue with fresh fruit is a favourite.

The extensive wine list features a delightful Viognier from the château's own vineyard. Guests can sample this during a wine tasting workshop. For a unique experience, you can enjoy a champagne picnic in the verdant vineyard. Saunter down there to find a lavish picnic all set up with wines, champagne, cold meats, cheeses, quiches and summer salads, with local jams and homemade cakes for dessert.

Just a stone's throw away, the chic Lido restaurant by Lac du Bourget tempts visitors with a high-end bistro menu paired with exquisite Savoyard wines. Its stunning lakeside setting, complete with a private beach, is ideal for lunch or dinner. For the ultimate romantic moment, visit at golden hour when the mist rolls in and the sun sets – it's a serious Instagram moment not to be missed.

The story:



Perched on a hillside overlooking Chambéry, Château de Candie dates back to the 14th century. This ivy-cloaked fortress has been transformed into a luxurious retreat while retaining its historic charm. The current owner, Richard Green, has filled the château with heirlooms, flea-market finds, and modern art, creating a unique blend of old and new.
